

# Seward Area Ski Trails

Near Seward are dozens of trails that meet nearly every level of expertise and interest. They range from easy and flat trails to steep, fast and short runs including several areas consistently groomed for skate skiing. You can find solitude or expansive views or a place to run with your dog or hang with your friends. All levels of difficulty exist. All of the winter trails are on public land and most are multi-use open to skiing, skijoring, snow machining, walking and snowshoeing.

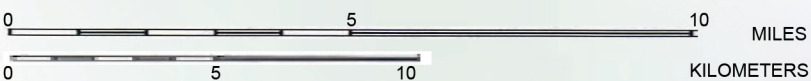
Seward Nordic Ski Club is a tax-exempt nonprofit, all-volunteer group. Weekly trail condition updates are available on the SNSC website.
